Keep trash out of limbs and brush

The City would like to remind its citizens to keep trash out of limb and brush piles put on the curb for collection.

The Public Works Department provides weekly brush collection services for City residents at no charge. Brush is collected the same day as garbage.

If there is trash in a limb or brush pile the City cannot collect it, as it will damage the collection truck. To ensure City workers can safely collect brush and other yard debris, place brush behind the curb or ditch along the street and do not block the street or sidewalk.

Limbs should be no longer than 10

feet and no larger than 3 inches in diameter.

Do not place brush beneath a power line or in a place that prevents the safe operation of City equipment.
