City Council Approves Budget

The Morganton City Council approved the City's 2018-19 Fiscal Year budget after holding a public hearing June 18, 2018.

This new budget brings changes for Morganton residents, including a decrease in electric bills.

Residential and small commercial customers can expect to see an approximately four percent decrease in their bills. Larger industrial and commercial customers will see a very slight increase of about 1.8 percent. This means a typical residential electric customer should notice an average decrease of \$4.80 per month. The change in electric rates will take hold July 1. The fixed facilities charge of \$200 per month for large industrial customers will also decrease to \$100 per month.

The approved budget comes with a few small increases in water, sewer and cable rates for customers, and a slight four cent ad valorem tax rate increase to 57 cents per \$100 of valuation. There will be no increase to internet and phone services to citizens.

This increase on taxes comes after five years of no change to the tax rate, during which the City has worked hard to keep

taxes low and value high for customers on all services provided by the City.

"We provide our residents with great services at a superb value, and we are proud of that," said City Manager Sally Sandy. "We are continuing to respond to the marketplace to provide the best bargain possible for our citizens."

The 2018-2019 General Fund budget includes funding for operations and the capital improvement program (CIP). Different from years past, the budget includes separate Capital Project funds for large, multi-year projects. Equipment replacements, park improvements, vehicle purchases, infrastructure improvements, and funds to begin masterplan implementations are included. The City staff continues to pursue grant and public/private partnership opportunities to finance capital projects. The General Fund CIP totals \$2,778,860.

Asheville, NC. Today, Nancy works primarily from her home studio in Concord, NC.


